Gina called the meeting to order at 4:02pm. Announcements

 Caroline Prijatel-Sutton – Coalition for Family Harmony holding 3rd Annual Denim Day Event on 4/24/24, a fundraiser to support 	
services provided for survivors of sexual assault.

3) Approval of the JJCC Meeting Minutes Dated February 21, 2024. Motion to approve minutes as submitted. Moved by Judge Romero; seconded by Denise. All in favor. Motion approved.	
4) Public Comments None.	
 5) Vote to Approve JJCC Fiscal Year (FY) 25 Budget Shawna Hunt presented the FY25 Budget: Total expenditures – \$6.1M. Roughly \$788K over approved budget for FY24. In addition to normal salary increases, as well as the increase in Public Health Memorandum Of Agreement, increase primarily due to maintaining newly approved services during FY24, such as Ventura Evening Reporting Center, Interface Youth Advocates, United Parents contract, and the Partnership for Safe Families contract. Revenue – state allocation has been stable. Growth funds are projected to be \$2.1M. Interest income – increased \$105K. 	
6) JJCC Program Review & Development Subcommittee Update	
Chris provided the following updates:	
 Marriage Family Therapist-Associate for Repeat Offender Prevention Program (ROPP) youth starts 1st week of May. 	
Finalizing Women Of Substance Men Of Honor contract, providing	
housing for adult Transition Age Youth (TAY) youth on juvenile probation and Secure Youth Treatment Facility (SYTF) youth.	
Chris introduced Caroline Prijatel-Sutton, Executive Director of Coalition for	
Family Harmony, to the group. She gave a presentation on the Youth Advocate	
(YA) role in the ROPP program and Coalition's proposal for increase in budget.	

Discussion/Conclusions	Recommendations/Actions
YAs provide mentoring, transportation, prosocials, family support, help youth	
complete probation terms, and more, while building positive rapport with ROPP	
youth.	
Caroline explained the importance of recruiting and retaining qualified YAs for	
at least 2 years, which is difficult at the current pay of only \$20/hr. Funding	
requested to increase salary of 2 YAs and YA Manager with small salary	
increases on an annual basis to remain competitive, and flexibility in	
establishing starting salaries for new YAs. Proposal includes \$5K for out-of-	
county travel for YAs to purchase meals for the youth.	
Discussion ensued about the success rate and impact of the ROPP program.	
Gina stated the Master Plan indicated this is a successful program.	
Denise moved to approve funding not to exceed \$239,624 for the	
Coalition's Youth Advocate Contract (this will be a new contract).	
Gina called for a vote on the motion.	
9 in favor; 0 opposed; 0 abstained. Motion passed.	
7) Planning Subcommittee for Realigned Youth	
Gina explained this group will meet 2 times/year for recommendations on plans	
related to SYTF youth to be submitted prior to May 1 st .	
Information on formation and duties of group is in By-laws. Subject to Brown	
Act and reports to JJCC.	
Group consists of the Chief Probation Officer (CPO) as Chair or Co-chair,	
depending on what the group decides, representatives from District Attorney,	Gina to contact HSA,
Public Defender, Human Services Agency, Ventura County Behavioral Health,	VCOE for
Ventura County Office of Education, Superior Court, 3 community members,	representatives.
and Co-chair if CPO is Co-chair.	
Gina asked group to suggest members to represent their agencies. Members	
volunteered or will have an agency representative attend: Cheryl Fox,	
Behavioral Health; Judge Romero, Juvenile Court; Michael Rodriguez, Public	
Defender; and Kevin Drescher, District Attorney.	
8) Ad Hoc Subcommittee to review and make recommendations as to the	
selection of representatives of Community Based Organization	
Gina asked for member volunteers to meet to recommend a Community Based	
Organization (CBO) representative for JJCC. There could be additional CBO	
recommendations, but no more than two others.
