## What is a Community Information Exchange?

A Community Information Exchange (CIE) is an ecosystem comprised of multidisciplinary network partners that use a shared language, a resource database, and an integrated technology platform to deliver enhanced community care planning. Care planning tools enable partners to integrate data from multiple sources and make bi-directional referrals to create a shared longitudinal record.

By focusing on these core components, a CIE enables communities to shift away from a reactive approach to providing care toward proactive, holistic, personcentered care. Ventura County CIE is hereinafter referred to as VCCIE.





#### **BEFORE VCCIE**

## Student Behavioral Health Incentive Program (SBHIP)



SBHIP increases the number of TK-12 students receiving preventive and early intervention behavioral health services provided by schools, providers in schools, school affiliated community-based organizations or clinics, county behavioral health departments and school districts, charter schools, and/or county offices of education within the county.



The VCCIE will facilitate this process by providing a system that referrals can be entered, progress tracked, and closed-loop visibility, serving VCOE students and families. Rio and Hueneme School Districts are our initial cohort.

## JJCPA Funding Supports CBO Participation in VCCIE



CBO Staff time to review and process the participation agreements: Participation agreements outline the privacy and security policies that govern participation in the VCCIE. The JJCPA funds will help cover the necessary CBO staff time associated with legal review and signing data use agreements.



**Onboarding and training of staff:** Successful participation requires a well-trained and informed staff. The JJCPA funds will help support CBO's capacity to participate in the technical assistance offered including onboarding sessions and training programs.



**Ongoing Participation:** Sustainable CBO participation is crucial for the ongoing success of the VCCIE. The funds will be allocated to support ongoing CBO engagement including their time to attend meetings, participate in quality improvement initiatives, and new employee training.





### **Funding Costs**

Budget Item	Cost (1yr)
Grants to Community Based Organizations	\$150,000
Public Health Institute Personnel	\$15,771
Travel (local)	\$996
Expenses & Recruitment Events	\$1,117
Indirect costs	\$9,647
Total	\$177,531

Note: Budget can be reduced to \$150k if funds are paid directly to the CBOs.
